

In the News: -

Racer Industries extends their partnership with Motorsport Australia. They will continue to be the Official Race Accessories Partner of the Shannons Speed Series, and the Bosch Motorsport Australia Rally Championship, First Gear and Motorsport Australia Esports.

Motorsport's new Sporting & Technical Director is Lisa Crampton. One of her responsibilities will be working with officials such as training etc.

Unfortunately Motorsport Australia confirmed an EBITDA deficit of \$517,792 but their balance sheet is strong with net assets totalling more than \$10 million

Australia Sporting Commission held a National Volunteer Week. There are over 10,000 volunteer officials within our motorsport community. Motorsport Australia President Andrew Fraser paid tribute to all these people who help make motorsport in this country thrive.

Women's Introduction to Motorsport will have 3 events this year. The first event will be at the Shell V-Power Motorsport Park in SA on the 15th June. It will be a hands-on experience, covering a whole range of topics and using their own road cars

Michelin are extending their support for the FIA Girls on Track and also Shannons SpeedSeries including being the Official Media Partner. They will also be the Official Tyre Partner for Motorsport Australia and its Member Rewards Program.

Tatts Finke Desert Race. The 2024 Tatts Finke Desert Race will be held at the remote community of Aputula on the 7-10 June. This is Australia's biggest off road event with over 130 entries and with Australia's best off road drivers all fighting for the title – King of the Desert.

FIA Motorsport Games.

The FIA Motorsport Games is a biennial motorsport event administered by the Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile. It includes competitions from multiple motorsport disciplines and is entered by national motorsport authorities under their national flags.

This year it will take place in Valencia, Spain in October. This is the 3rd time for the multidisciplinary event which is growing each year. Competitors come from all around the world for this 4 day festival. They have included more categories. Categories include circuit racing, karting, rally slalom and Esports to name just a few.

Light Car Club of Australia Centenary Luncheon

Sunday July 21 2024



A special luncheon will be held to celebrate the centenary of the formation of the Victorian Light Car Club, later to become the **Light Car Club of Australia**. The first meeting to form the club was held on November 5, 1924.

The club was a leader in motor sport in Australia. It took over the organisation of the **Alpine Rally**, the second oldest car rally in the world, from the RACV in 1926. It organised the **first Australian Grand Prix** at Phillip Island in 1928, established the **Rob Roy and Lakeland** hill climbs and initiated long distance touring car racing by organising the **Armstrong 500** races at Phillip Island, later to become the Bathurst 1000 classic.

The club brought car racing to the heart of Melbourne by running meetings **at Albert Park** from 1953 to 1958 bringing many international drivers including Stirling Moss to Australia. It took over the organisation of motor racing at **Sandown Park** in 1966, ran the fabulous **Fangio Sandown meeting** in 1978 and the 1982 **Tribute to the Champions** meeting with Stirling Moss, Jack Brabham, John Surtees, Phil Hill, Denny Hulme Alan Jones, Dan Gurney and Chris Amon. Both meetings were facilitated by journalist/entrepreneur Paul Higgins.

The club ran the first ever World Championship motor race meeting held in Australia at Sandown in 1984, a round of the World Sports Car Championship. Adelaide had been granted a Formula 1 Grand Prix, so sports cars were the next best option. The meeting lost a large sum and the property at 19 Brunswick Street Fitzroy, the club's first clubrooms had to be sold. A number of successful Sandown race meetings helped to balance the books, but a Second World Sports car race in 1988 lost money again and forced the club into bankruptcy.

The Light Car Club was an innovative club, run by distinguished and forward thinking people. Members included **Arthur Terdich**, winner of the second Australian Grand Prix in a Bugatti and organiser of many of the early club events, and such famous motor sport identities as **Lex Davison**, **Bib Stillwell**, **Bill Patterson**, **Stan Jones and Harry Firth**.


